The Community Kitchen dining room has reopened as of January 3rd, 2023! We have snowy and cold days to come and we want to provide a space for individuals and families to eat in a dignified and safe manner. We have missed the sense of community our dining room provided prior to closing.

The Community Kitchen continues to serve breakfast, lunch, and provides sack lunches. The time commitment for each of these are Monday-Friday **Breakfast:** 7am-9:30am (can arrive at 6:30 to hand out sack lunches) Lunch: 10am-1pm (Groups of 4-6) Sack lunches, as needed, but please schedule with Cross-Lines Staff member.
